Apple's new iPhone, which has only one button, relies on a new touch-screen interface that lets users control everything with their fingertips.



## It's a phone

Calls are placed by touching a name or number in an address book, favorites list or call log. Calls can be merged to create conference calls.



## It's an answering machine

"Visual voice mail," a first, lets users pick which voicemail message they want to listen to first.



## It's got mail

Rich HTML e-mail client displays photos and graphics along with text. Users can multitask by surfing the Web while downloading mail.



## It's got widgets

Small applications provide real-time stock reports, weather updates and more.



## It's a text messenger



Texting application with predictive soft keyboard prevents and corrects typing mistakes.

## It's a camera



2-megapixel camera and photo management application lets users access photos from their PC or Mac, and browse or e-mail them.

## It's an atlas



Maps application shows maps and satellite images, with access to driving directions and traffic reports.

## It's an entertainment center



Widescreen iPod plays music, audiobooks, videos, movies and TV shows on a 3.5-inch display.

## It's a computer



Safari browser with built-in Google and Yahoo search lets users view full Web pages, then zoom in with a tap of the fingers.
